Brandon Huddleson, County Administrator, wanted to recognize how peaceful the recent protest was in Xenia, as well as the larger gathering in Beavercreek on the same day. He said the Beavercreek Police Department did a great job taking care of everyone. While nerves are raw at this time, those who protested should be commended for protesting in the right way without damage or destruction, he added.

Mr. Koogler said the time and planning by law enforcement that went into preparing for the protestors was tremendous. Demonstrators had their voices heard, which is their right, in the right way, he added. Mr. Glaser said there is a great working relationship between Beavercreek Police Chief Dennis Evers and Greene County Sheriff Gene Fischer. He commended them as well as the protestors not only in Beavercreek and Xenia, but also in Fairborn. Mr. Gould added that people are encouraged to exercise their right and let their voices be heard.

Mr. Gould added that he condemns the person or persons who shot the Greene County Democrat Headquarters in Xenia. Everyone is entitled to their opinions and beliefs and to disagree, but not in this manner.
